Scholarship Performance in the Major

A minimum grade of C- must be attained in all upper-level courses numbered in the 2000s through 4000s that are required for the major. A grade of B or better is required in SMPA 2110 in order to apply to or remain in the major.

Special Honors in Journalism and Mass Communication

Students with a 3.7 GPA in all courses completed at GW and in all courses required for the major may apply for Special Honors in journalism and mass communication. Students intending to apply must consult with their advisor at the start of the senior year. Application must be made by the mid-point of the student's final semester (October 15 or March 15) and must include a letter of application and a portfolio of published or broadcast work. The work will be evaluated by the journalism and mass communication faculty on the basis of professional standards as outlined by the department. Students interested in pursuing Special Honors through writing a research thesis should consult their advisor.
