Scholarship Performance in the Major

A minimum grade of C- must be attained in all upper-level courses numbered in the 2000s through 4000s in order to count them toward the major. A grade of C or better is required in SMPA 2102 in order to remain in the major.

Special Honors in Political Communication

Students with a 3.7 GPA in all courses completed at GW and in all courses required for the major may declare for Special Honors in political communication at the beginning of the senior year. Students take <u>SMPA 4199</u> Senior Seminar in the first semester of the senior year and <u>SMPA 4198</u> Special Honors Research Seminar in the second semester. To achieve Special Honors, the student must maintain the required GPA and present a successful oral defense of a research paper prepared for the Honors Research Seminar before a committee that includes the seminar instructor and two other faculty members nominated by the student and approved by the seminar instructor.
