The survey was fielded October 10-24, 2004 by YouGov. It was the third wave of a panel survey which is interviewing the same respondents multiple times over the presidential campaign. YouGov interviewed 1795 respondents in October as part of a third recontact of 2750 interviewed in June, and 2011 interviewed in September. These respondents were a subset of a sample matched to a sampling frame on gender, age, race, and education. The sampling frame is a politically representative "modeled frame" of US adults, based upon the American Community Survey (ACS) public use microdata file, public voter file records, the 2020 Current Population Survey (CPS) Voting and Registration supplements, the 2020 National Election Pool (NEP) exit poll, and the 2020 CES surveys, including demographics and 2020 presidential vote. The cases were weighted to the sampling frame using propensity scores. The matched cases and the frame were combined and a logistic regression was estimated for inclusion in the frame. The propensity score function included age, gender, race/ethnicity, years of education, and region. The propensity scores were grouped into deciles of the estimated propensity score in the frame and post-stratified according to these deciles. The weights were then post-stratified on party ID, 2020 presidential vote choice, as well as a four-way stratification of gender, age (4-categories), race (4-categories), and education (4-categories), to produce the final weight. The margin of error for the October wave full sample is +/- 2%. Margin of error for partisan subsamples in October wave is +/- 4%.
