2018 MIDTERM ELECTION WAVE 2

The survey was fielded July 23 – August 9, 2018, by YouGov with a sample of registered voters. This was the second survey in a four-wave panel design focusing on the 2018 midterm election.

We re-interviewed 2,716 respondents of the original 3,150 who participated in the GW Politics Poll conducted in May 2018. The re-interview rate was 77%.

YouGov recruits individuals into their panels in a variety of ways and then uses sample matching to create a representative sample from a non-randomly selected pool.

YouGov has constructed a sampling frame of U.S. Citizens from the 2012 American Community Survey, including data on age, race, gender, education, marital status, number of children under 18, family income, employment status, citizenship, state and metropolitan area. First wave N = 3,150, second wave N = 2,716.

The partial toplines reported below are based on frequencies using weight variable provided by YouGov for the sample. The margin of error for the full sample is +/- 2%.
