GW POLITICS POLL 2018 MIDTERM ELECTION WAVE 4

The survey was fielded December 11-19, 2018 by YouGov with a sample of registered voters. This was the fourth survey in a four-wave panel design focusing on the 2018 midterm election. We re-interviewed 2,260 respondents of the original 3,150 who participated in the GW Politics Poll conducted in May 2018. The re-interview rate was 72%.

YouGov recruits individuals in a variety of ways into their panel and then uses sample matching to create a representative sample from this non-randomly selected pool. For the original May sample, YouGov has constructed a sampling frame of U.S. Citizens from the 2012 American Community Survey, including data on age, race, gender, education, marital status, number of children under 18, family income, employment status, citizenship, state and metropolitan area. Our December results are based on a sample of 1,920 registered voters who answered all four waves of the survey. The 2,260 individuals interviewed across all four waves were matched down to a sample of 1,920 to produce the final dataset using a sampling frame constructed from the November 2016 Current Population Survey (our December panel respondents were matched to the frame on gender, age, race and education to produce the final sample). Previous wave samples: First wave (May 2018) N=3,150, second wave (July-August 2018) N=2,716, third wave (October 2018) N=2,321.

The partial toplines reported below are based on frequencies using a weight variable provided by YouGov for the sample. We provide results using the full samples from the December, October, July-August and May survey waves. The margin of error for the full sample is +/- 2%.
